Welcome to this week's newsletter. Some important information is repeated for your convenience, but there is also new content to be read.

## **Current COVID-19 Guidance**


- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days
- Regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education setting

Please ensure your child brings a refillable water bottle to school every day.

Please find below some of the key dates relating to Y11 final examinations. As you may know, the GCSE examinations are rather more staggered this year.





As the English GCSEs loom ever closer, I wanted to take this opportunity to remind you, as parents, what is currently in place for your students to ensure success in English Language and Literature. We currently offer after school revision classes (for 5-7 and 7-9 targets) either on Tuesday or Wednesdays of each week, as well as smaller group sessions on Monday, Wednesday and Friday in mentor time. There will also be an intensive revision session on the Monday of half term (30th May) from 9:30 until 2pm approximately - more details on this to follow. Any additional work that your student produces will be marked and students sit one exam-style essay lesson every two







weeks. 

# **Keeping your child safe on railway lines**

This message contains some information regarding keeping your child safe on railway lines and is from Learn Live. Due to the very high level of trespassing on the tracks by young people in your local area, Network Rail in partnership with the Learn Live News Channel are working to help raise awareness to students across the UK educating them about the dangers of the train tracks through interactive digital delivery.

The session is less than 15 minutes and explains why it is important to stay safe near the tracks.

Over 14 million students, parents and teachers from across the UK have watched these videos which has led to a significant decrease in the number of trespasses in their area through watching the latest rail safety videos.

Remember 15 mins can help save lives and provide important safety information to young people and their parents.


