Please see relevant information listed below that may offer support for your family, some information is new and some information has been held over from last week's newsletter.

### Access to the School Site from Start of Autumn Term

To improve security and ensure the safety of our school community we are changing the access to the school site. Parents will no longer be able to drive into school to pick up or drop off students (unless you need to do so in an emergency or have a site access card). If your child has a temporary disability such as a broken leg, you can of course use the intercom system to be given access to the site within office hours.

There is a set of automatic gates just inside our main school gates which, like all the other school gates, will only be opened via an intercom to the main school office during school hours.

If you bring students to school by car, please drop them in a quiet side street and do not park across the yellow hatching as this endangers students walking or cycling into school.

## **Behaviour & Attitudes**

We were delighted with the behaviour and general conduct of the students last week; there was a real sense of focus and engagement in lessons around the school, which was great to see. One area we would like to continue to improve is uniform and we're asking for your ongoing support as parents/carers to ensure that your child is in the correct uniform for the school day. As a school, we are continuing our work to ensure that the cost of uniform is reasonable and secures the best value for money (in line with DfE guidance). We are also looking at how we can better support families and with this in mind, we will continue to make sure that second-hand uniform is routinely available and that any additional support we're made aware of is advertised on our school website, within the 'Family Support' section. With regards to students' uniform, particular areas we'd like to address are jewellery and shoes: Click Here

#### <u>Jewellery</u>

One set of studs in ears (flat or rounded only). All other piercings MUST be clear studs. Any other jewellery to be discreet. In the event that a student has a visible body piercing which can't be removed, it must be covered with a suitable plaster.

#### Shoes

Trainers that are fabric or with noticeable logos are not acceptable.

#### Year 7 - welcome to languages!

Our new year 7s are now settling into their language learning journey here at Dane Court and seem to be enjoying their experience so far. Here are some thoughts on how you as a parent/carer can help and support your child. Language learning should be viewed a little like learning an instrument; your child will need time, space and encouragement to practise regularly.

Most students, whichever language they are studying, will have a fortnightly vocabulary test - you could help by testing them and get them to tell you when their vocab tests are due. They are usually on the same day every fortnight.

There are a host of ways to learn vocab: using flashcards, "look-copy-cover-check", follow the links provided by your child's teacher to the online vocab platforms quizlet and memrise. Encourage your child to teach you their new words, or explain pronunciation rules. Support your child with smart use of resources and help promote sensible use of online dictionaries. Unfortunately, simply inserting chunks of text into Google translate will not help develop your child's skills - and it is usually obvious to the teacher as well!

## **Bus route updates**

As part of this review of the local bus network in the Thanet area, some services operated by Stagecoach on a commercial basis will be discontinued. This may affect students travelling to and from school. Where we've had to reduce services (as an absolute last resort), we have provided alternative suggestions outlined below:

#### Hartsdown Academy, King Etherlbert School

- The route **932** bus at 0825 from Margate to Minnis Bay will no longer operate. Please use the 0823 route 932 bus from Margate which has spare capacity.
- The 0801 route 932 bus from Dane Valley will also run along Maynard Avenue in order to serve Garlinge Primary School.
- The 1505 route **932** bus from Hartsdown Academy to Margate will no longer operate. Please use the route 32 service as an alternative.

#### Royal Harbour Academy (Newlands Lane), Dane Court Grammar School

• The 0728 route **933** bus from Cliftonville to Dane Court will no longer operate. Please use the Loop, 946 or 960 service instead.

#### Hartsdown Academy, King Etherlbert School, Dane Court Grammar School, St George's School

• The **943** bus will be rerouted to avoid reversing at St. Nicholas, The Oaks.

## Royal Harbour Academy, St George's School

• The route **946** bus will be rerouted to serve St Lawrence, Newington Road, The Royal Harbour Academy, Dane Court and St George's School to replace part of route 933.

#### Dane Court Grammar School, St George's School

- The **948** bus at 0740 from Cliftonville will be renumbered route 960.
- The **949** bus at 0742 from St Peters Railway Bridge will be renumber route 960 and depart St. Peter's Railway Bridge at 0732, serving Kingsgate, Northdown Park, Cliftonville, Dane Valley, Laleham Corner, Margate, St George's School and Dane Court School.
- The **948** bus at 1535 from Dane Court will no longer operate. Instead, please use the 1535 route 960 bus that will be rerouted to St. Peters, Kingsgate, Northdown Park, Cliftonville (The Wheatsheaf), Dane Valley, Warwick Road and Margate.

#### Ramsgate schools - Chatham and Clarendon House Grammar Schools

• The **989** bus will no longer operate. Please use the Loop and 8/8A service instead.

From the same date there will also be some changes affecting other routes and services in the area. 
## **Emotional Wellbeing Practitioners at Dane Court Grammar School**

Dane Court Grammar school welcomes the Emotional Wellbeing Team back for another year - Sarah Johnson and Emily Barker are Emotional Wellbeing Practitioners who work within our school, and are hoping to get to know you and your child over the coming weeks and months, offering support when needed and finding out your ideas about how we can all work together to support the emotional wellbeing and mental health of students at Dane Court Grammar School. Emotional Wellbeing Practitioners (EWPs) are part of a new government initiative that aims to promote good emotional wellbeing and mental health through supporting children and their families through prevention, early intervention and education. There are a number of different ways we may be able to support your child within school such as individual targetted support, student groups and workshops. We support young people who are experiencing mild to moderate difficulties with worry, anxiety, low mood, phobias, or sleep difficulties. We also offer parent groups and online workshops, and support the school to develop a 'whole school approach' to emotional wellbeing and mental health. We hope this information was useful, and we look forward to working with Dane Court Grammar School. ## NHS Emotional Wellbeing Practitioner Team Workshops

We are inviting all parents to join online workshops that are being run by our team over the next few months. These workshops offer information around key topics to help understand what is going on for your child, and strategies to support them. We know that it has been an especially difficult over the past couple of years, and we want to ensure that parents feel equipped to support their child. These workshops run monthly on rotation and cover: Understanding ADHD, Understanding Autism, understanding your child's behaviour, and supporting your child with worries and fears.

We hate waste and love seeing good quality preloved clothes going where they're needed most.



## Roald Dahl Day 13.9.22

Roald Dahl Day celebrates this creative master and all of the work that he has done by bringing stories of fiction and wonder to children everywhere. It wasn't until more than 60 years after his first book was published, and more than 15 years after his death, that Roald Dahl Day was instituted in 2006. The first day took place on what would have been his 90th birthday.

Millions of children, and adults too, have spent delightful hours entering into the world of Dahl's imagination, and this was the perfect way to pay homage to this creative genius. Since his books have been so popular (translated into at least 58 languages), the day to honour Dahl has been enjoyed and celebrated in countries all over the world.
