We have recently had a number of reports from local residents regarding unsafe and illegal parking in nearby streets. We appreciate that parking around the school is limited but parking in an unsafe way can endanger the lives of our students and other pedestrians. We are committed to safeguarding our students and ask that you take notice of the following:

- Please do not park in the school entrance or exit or on the hazard lines either side of the entrance and exit gates.
- Please park considerately when dropping off or picking up your child. Please do not park on our neighbours driveways or over their drop curbs, even if this is only for a few minutes.
- Please do not attempt to access the school car park using the security gates unless you have a temporary car park access pass.
- Please try to drop off/pick up your child from one of the local quiet side streets.
- Unfortunately, we have had some reports from local residents of verbal abuse and aggressive behaviour from parents over parking issues.








MIND at Dane Court Grammar School

This is a final reminder of our offer of a face to face training session to our community in school to support understanding of everyday mental health for all and the challenges that are faced when supporting others. The training will be delivered by the mental health charity MIND at Dane Court Grammar School on Tuesday 23rd May from 4-5pm.

This free one-hour course focuses on stress, self-care, and the ways in which we can support others – providing a dedicated space and time where people can build their knowledge and reflect on how the current climate may be having a detrimental impact on mental health.

Developed in partnership with the Kent & Medway ICS Suicide Prevention Programme Team, this session aims to help people better understand their own mental health and wellbeing, and then how to apply that improved knowledge to the steps they can take to support others.

As a part of this session we will also explore the support services available across Kent & Medway – enabling people to better understand the support which is available to them within the communities in which we work.

The Objectives of this training session are as follows:

- Recognise the impact that negative stressors such as debt can have on a person's mental health.
- Understand how to support your own mental health and wellbeing during the current financial crisis.
- Have the confidence to support someone else who may be struggling with poor mental health.
- Have a greater awareness of the range of services available in Kent & Medway that can support someone who is struggling with their mental health or experiencing financial difficulty.

Exam Dates for yr11s

Please see below confirmation of the final exam dates for year 11s this year.

26th May: Last day of formal lessons (students may choose to continue to attend school to revise and prepare after this date).

21st June: Is the date of the last scheduled exam. But all students need to remain available until the 28th June.

28th June: Is the contingency date that is allowed for in case exams are moved by exam board at late notice. This is an official date given by the exam board and therefore all year 11s need to remain available to sit any exam that may be moved to this period.

PE reminder:

Please can you ensure if your child has a piercing that cannot be removed, they must come into PE with their own medical tape to cover them and a note from parent/carer advising the school as to when they can be removed. We recommend any new piercings wait until the beginning of the summer holidays please. Any injured students must have a note from parents/carers to email the school to inform so we are aware. If an injury requires more than one week of not participating in PE, we do need a note/evidence from a medical professional please. Students must still bring in and change into PE kit unless their injury makes it too painful or impossible to do.

School absence procedure

It is important to remind you that if your child is going to be absent from school, you must call the absence line, 01843 864941, option 1, or email: csayer@danecourt.kent.sch.uk as soon as possible, or at the very latest by 10am. Unless **pre-arranged** you are required to do this **every day your child is absent.** From a safeguarding perspective, your cooperation with this is essential and appreciated.

Student Safeguarding after 3.20pm

A reminder to parents regarding the safeguarding of their children if staying in school after 3.20pm.

- Students must not be unaccompanied in school, except in the Heart area.
- Students must leave site by 4.20pm, unless in an extended lesson/club, attending a detention, or waiting for an event
- Staff accompany students to the exit when it is time to leave.

Bicycle Safety at School

Please be aware that the bicycle shed is **NOT a safe place to leave a bike overnight.** If students need to leave a bicycle overnight for whatever reason or even whilst at an after-school club, the bicycle needs to be put it in the main bicycle shed when they first arrive at school to save wheeling it through the school. The bicycle cage at the front of the school is locked overnight, but please also ensure your child's bicycle has a lock, lights, and that they use a bicycle helmet. We would also like to raise awareness for students cycling in the winter months in the dark having good reflective gear and lights on their bicycles to ensure they can be seen clearly by other road users.

Family Support

Financial concerns

At Dane Court Grammar School, we are committed to ensuring that finances are not a barrier to accessing educational trips and essential equipment for lessons; therefore financial support may be available. If you have difficulty contributing to the cost of a trip or essential equipment, please contact the school office at admin@danecourt.kent.sch.uk) or the Sixth Form office (abowen@danecourt.kent.sch.uk) to discuss anything.

Please check if your child is eligible for free school meals.

With the cost of living crisis creating increased challenges for our community, we ask all parents to check if their child is eligible to receive free school meals. Applying for free school meals if you are eligible will mean enhanced pupil premium funding for the school. This will not only allow us to pay for school trips, study materials and revision guides for your child, but will also allow increased funding for the quality of education at Dane Court as a whole. We would be very grateful for your help: please apply if you are eligible.

Who is eligible for free school meals?

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following. For full information, visit https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals.

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

I think my child is eligible for free school meals. What do I do now?

You should apply for free school meals via the Kent County Council website. Kent County Council will then inform the school to allow us to access the funding, so you don't have to do anything else.

What if I am worried that my child will be embarrassed at school?


Please do not worry. Our systems are extremely discreet, and our electronic payment system in the school canteen means that it is impossible to tell who is receiving a free school meal. Many students receive free school meals at our school.

Free School Meals - how they work

Please be aware that if your child receives free school meals, this is how the system works on a daily basis

- Your child will receive £1.10 for breakfast; which they <u>must</u> use before period 1 at 8.40am, if the £1.10 is not used by 8.40am then it is withdrawn from the account. For students to take advantage of the breakfast free school meal they must be in school in time to use it before period 1.
- They will then receive £2.30 for lunch, which they can use from breaktime at 10.45am onwards until the end of lunch at 2.20pm. The best value meal available is the lunch time main meal which comes with and main course and pudding bought simultaneously.





Any unspent funds are **not** carried over from day to day, and a new amount is added each day. You can add cash to your child's account using Wisepay if you wish, for extra snacks. But please note that the money given for free school meals should be spent where possible on food and not drinks to get the best value for money.

PP funding for ingredients

Did you know that if your child is eligible for PP funding, we are able to help to provide ingredients for them to cook with. Please get in touch with Mrs Edmondson or Mrs Leese to make arrangements for this to happen if you will find supplying ingredients difficult.

World Bee Day

World Bee Day is celebrated on May 20 each year. The purpose of the international day is to acknowledge the role of bees and other pollinators for the ecosystem.

Every year on this day, the global public will focus on the importance of preserving honey bees and all other pollinators. People will be reminded of the significance of bees in providing for the needs of humanity.


Did you know:

- 1. Though bees have jointed legs, they do not possess anything like a kneecap, and therefore do not have knees.
- 2. Honey has antiseptic properties and was historically used as a dressing for wounds and a first aid treatment for burns and cuts.
- 3. The natural fruit sugars in honey fructose and glucose are quickly digested by the body. This is why sportsmen and athletes use honey to give them a natural energy boost.
- 4. The practice of beekeeping dates back at least 4,500 years.
- 5. Bees must gather nectar from two million flowers to make one pound of honey
- 6. One bee has to fly about 90,000 miles three times around the globe to make one pound of honey.
- 7. The average bee will make only 1/12th of a teaspoon of honey in its lifetime.
- 8. A honey bee visits 50 to 100 flowers during a collection trip.
- 9. A honey bee can fly for up to six miles, and as fast as 15 miles per hour.
- 10. Bees communicate by dancing.
