## Sporting fixtures spectator procedures at DCGS OUTSIDE AFTER SCHOOL FIXTURES

- All parents/carers wishing to watch an after school outdoor fixture must ensure they sign in and out at the Dane Court main school reception. They must wear their sign-in vistors badge at all times so it is visible to staff and students.
- Parents/carers MUST arrive between 3.00 and 3.20 to sign in at the main school reception and wait in the reception area.
- Parents/carers cannot watch fixtures during school hours.
- Promptly at 3.30 the PE assistant or PE teacher will be over to escort parents to the fixture site (and pick up a register of who has signed in and take that to the teacher on the fixture) which is where parents must stay until the fixture is finished. Parents/Carers will enter the school site with the PE assistant/teacher through the side gate by the sports building.
- No dogs or any other animals are allowed within the school grounds at any of our fixtures. Unless they are a support/guidance dog.
- No photos or filming is permitted.
- Parents/carers are then only permitted to be where the fixture is held and not to go around any
  other part of the school or its grounds. Unfortunately there are no toilet facilities for spectators
  whilst a fixture is going on.
- The teacher on the fixture will escort parents off site, collect badges and sign spectators out on the paper register brought over in the beginning.
- Please be aware that unfortunately due to spectators needing to be escorted to the fixture if anyone is later than 3.20 you will not be able to gain entry as no one from PE will be around to take you over to the fixture and around the school property.

#### **PARKING:**

Spectators must park outside of the school grounds.

If you are disabled please contact reception in advance and they will let you into the school grounds to park.

#### **LARGE FIXTURES OR EVENTS:**

Unfortunately larger events (with more than two other schools attending) we cannot have parents/carers spectate as we do not have enough Dane Court staff to be with all spectators. This includes but is not limited to any primary events held here, Cross Country and Sports day.

#### **INDOOR FIXTURES:**

Indoor fixtures: owing to space only students and teachers are permitted to spectate any indoor fixtures

#### **AWAY FIXTURES:**


Spectating policies differ from school to school so we encourage parents/carers to contact the away team to see if parents are allowed on their site to spectate. It is the parents/carers responsibility to ensure they are allowed on site before turning up.

#### SCHOOLS ATTENDING DCGS GROUNDS:

- This information will also be given to the team visiting us to play so they are aware of our policy and it is the other schools responsibility to inform their parents and/or quardians.
- Teachers from visiting schools must sign themselves and their team in at the main DC reception and PE assistant will meet them and bring them over to PE area/fixture site.
- Any parents/carers who would like to spectate from the opposing schools, will have the same protocol as the home parents/carers and must arrive between 3.00-3.20. At 3.30, after school has finished, they will be escorted to the fixture by the PE assistant.
- Parents/carers cannot watch fixtures during school hours.
- If parents/carers are later than 3.20pm they will unfortunately not be able to watch the fixture as we will not have a member of staff to escort them to the fixture.

#### Food Preparation and Nutrition - Notice for year 7 parents:

Year 7 have been given a sheet for the practical food lessons this term. This information will usually be shared with them on Google classroom the lesson prior to a practical. However for term one this is issued as a paper copy.

It is really important that every student brings a named container to bring their food home in - a tupperware tub, biscuit or cake tin, empty ice cream tub are all suitable. Students should be communicating their requirements for practical lessons each week. In some circumstances we are able to help families out if there is a difficulty with providing ingredients. #### Dane Court Grammar School. Year 7 Food lessons ingredients list.

Remember to ALWAYS bring in a **NAMED** container to take the food home in. Label food in the fridge. You may wish to substitute certain ingredients to accommodate different dietary needs or preferences. Some ideas are given in the table below.

	Ingredients list	Possible variations
1	None required. Make sure you decorate / cover your book for homework and bring 50p for ingredients next week!	Inform your teacher if you have any particular dietary needs before next lesson
2	Grilled pizza roll - bring 50p we will provide ingredients and a named container	Bring in any extra toppings you would like to add - (any meat MUST be pre cooked)
3	Fruit crumble  Stewed fresh fruit or tinned fruit or pie filling  40g block of butter /baking margarine  30g sugar  80g plain flour  25g rolled oats (optional)  Named small ovenproof dish or foil container can be bought from school	Don't forget to bring a small oven proof dish or 30p to pay for a foil dish to cook the crumble in.  To save money try to stew some seasonal fruits from your garden e.g apples and blackberries or plums or gooseberries or rhubarb. You could defrost any fruits you have frozen e.g. raspberries, strawberries.
4	Pasta salad  Tog dried pasta  Dressing - e.g. mayonnaise, natural yoghurt, creme fraiche, salad cream, balsamic vinegar,  Choose three + extra ingredients  e.g. spring onions, peas, sweetcorn, tomatoes, apple, celery, peppers, cucumber, fresh parsley, tinned tuna, ham, chickpeas, smoked salmon, cheese, tinned beans, chorizo etc  Named container	-You will be able to customise your own pasta salad by making choices on the ingredients to add to your dish.  If you decide to bring fish or meat - it must NOT be raw, choose cooked or tinned instead and make sure it is stored in the fridges at the start of the day.  Try to make sure some of your extra ingredients are ones that you can prepare in lesson (chop, shred, peel, grate etc)

6	Bolognese sauce  200g (one small pack) mince meat, veggie alternative mince or tinned lentils.  1 small onion 1 clove of garlic 1 can chopped tomatoes 1 beef Oxo cube (or vegetable Oxo cube) *Half a teaspoon of dried mixed herbs*  1 dessert spoon of tomato puree*  1 tablespoon oil*	-Beef, lamb, Quorn or soya mince or tinned lentils -Vegetable oxo cube -Herbs of your choice (*starred items above can be bought from school all for a total of 15p)  Don't forget a named container such as a tupperware box labelled with your name!

### **Hot Options:** Any Main Meal & Dessert Includes 1 of the following: Main Meal of the day. Freshly Filled Baked Jacket Potato. Hot Pasta Pot of the day. Also includes 1 of the following: Daily Dessert, Whole Piece of Fruit or Cookie. Salad Options: Option 1 Self Service Salad Bar including a Protein Pot. Piece of Whole Fruit, Homemade Cookie or Daily Dessert. Option 2 16oz cold Pasta Pot. Piece of Whole Fruit, Homemade Cookie or Daily Dessert. Sandwich Options: Choice of Sandwich or Baguette, filling choice Cheese, Ham, Tuna, Egg or Chicken Piece of whole Fruit, Homemade Cookie or daily Dessert of the Day.

#### **Meal Deals in School**

We use a cashless biometric system, which also allows you to set a daily spending limit to help your child help to budget.
