Sharing information on Measles / MMR vaccination

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease. We are asking education settings to share key messages from the NHS about MMR / measles and how to get vaccinated.

The <u>Back to school MMR Guidance</u> from the NHS includes information to share, as well as example social media posts which can be found here: NHS Vaccine Poster and NHS MMR Poster.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in a classroom can catch the disease if just one child is infectious. Please share these resources with colleagues, parents, and where suitable, community organisations to increase awareness and encourage parents to get their children vaccinated.

<u>Message for Year 11 parents:</u>

To further support your child's GCSE success, each individual subject department has produced a specialist information resource called 'How to Revise in...'. The resource includes research-informed information about the most effective ways to revise, links to online resources and questions you can ask you child at home to support their learning. Please do ask about the sheet and encourage your young person to pop to my office at the end of the N Plaza (where they have mentoring) to collect for any subjects that they need to prioritise in the upcoming PPEs. These are excellent resources to have on your fridge year round to refer to, and thanks in advance for your support in improving the GCSE outcomes of your children.

Hemmed Skirts

Please be aware that some of our students are beginning to 'hem' their skirts to make them shorter. We welcome parent support in helping us to ensure that all uniform is appropriate. Whilst we commend the creativity(!), we are keen that all students are taking pride in their uniform within school and the wider community.

Unsupervised Gyms

We have been made aware of a couple of remotely operated gyms in the Westwood Cross area which use pin codes for entry, rather than being overseen by professionals. Most equipment and gyms require users to be over the age of 16, but it has become apparent that a number of younger students are currently accessing them. Our primary concern is that these facilities are predominantly unsupervised and unvetted, as well as being open to the wider public, leaving our young people at risk of harm. We would advise all parents/carers/guardians to check the reputability of the gyms and age stipulations prior to signing up.

<u>Safeguarding Bulletin</u>

- Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) have released a new tool that allows children and young adults to report an inappropriate image or video of themselves that has been uploaded somewhere online. They may also report an image or video that they fear may be uploaded to the internet at some point in the future. The IWF will then take steps to remove the image from the Internet completely and assign a 'hash' to prevent the image being uploaded by anyone after.

We urge all parents to make their children aware of this new tool as it could really help a student who may make a mistake in the future.



Late Arrival in School

Please be reminded that students are expected to arrive and be in class by 8.40am. If a student arrives late it is disruptive to the class and means that they miss the teacher's instructions and introduction to the lesson. It can also cause embarrassment for the student having to enter the classroom late. The school pedestrian gates open at 8.00am so students can arrive in time to get to their lockers etc before classes start at 8.40. Once the pedestrian gates are closed at 9am, any student arriving after this time will need to press the intercom buzzer, which is to the right of the gate, so that the office staff can let them through. Frequent lateness can soon add up to a considerable amount of learning lost and can seriously disadvantage your child.

It is wonderful to see all students enjoying building their culinary skills.. They've made pizza & crumble (year 7), vegetable chow mein & potatoes four ways (year 8), egg fried rice & bombay potatoes (year 9) & cream cheese, vegetable spring rolls (year 10) so far and seasonal cooking which includes tartes pies in year 12.

Ingredients for food lessons


