The safe space will be occupied by two police officers, who will be on hand to help if needed, but can also provide advise on staying safe in our towns. Ramsgate Police Station safe space opening hours are 8pm till 3am on the 8th and 9th December 2023, 15th and 16th December 2023, 22nd and 23rd December 2023 and 31st December 2023.


